What it means to be a Father?

As usual our InsideOut Dad class at Wakulla Correctional Institution is exceptional. As a facilitator I allow for lots of participation and interaction among the men. Our class numbers 95.

Newsworthy was the recent altercation between Pastor Creflo Dollar and his daughter. Each man gave their input as to how they would have handled the situation. It was important for them to express what it means to be a man and father even while in prison.

Nearing the end of class, one inmate raised his hand to say that was all good, but his situation was unique. He stated his great-grandfather went to prison, also his grandfather, his father and of course he's in prison, and now one of his sons is in prison. Talk about taking your breath away and during his conversation every man was silent. Even I whom am never speechless had to take a few minutes to recompose myself and let all the men know how speechless I was. This was a testimony of how <u>NOT</u> to be a father.

Statistics show that 70% of inmates' children will follow their parent to prison.

This is an important and real statement. His father spoke how it wasn't too bad in prison and obviously he followed suit and so did one of his sons. He stated every Wednesday he





writes his other children to constantly remind them that prison is terrible, no decision in what you eat, always told when to go to bed and when to get up. Using a reality check are his words he uses to keep them from coming to prison by letting them know how bad it is and that it is not for them.

This is why it's critical to invest in our ministry by helping us reduce the number of our youth from falling into the same pattern as their incarcerated parents.

Re-read the story again. It does take your breath away to know that prison like other things in life may take on generational characteristics-- in this case passing from the great-grandfather to the grandfather to the father and now his son. How sad a commentary that the father spoke how prison wasn't too bad marking the future path for his son and grandson.

We hear of fathers and sons in prison at the same time, not necessarily in the same prison, but for similar crimes and similar sentencing. It's not confined only to fathers and sons, but brothers, uncles, daughters, and the list goes on. Living Stones is undertaking a great responsibility to partner with The Service Network: Children of Inmates. Our first bonding visit is already in the works for Wakulla Correctional Institution Annex.


