"A Mind: Terrible Thing To Waste"



While preparing for college in 1969, I learned about The United Negro College Fund through their motto "a mind is a terrible thing to waste." Their motto still resonates today for our children of inmates. Often children with incarcerated parents demonstrate difficulties in paying attention, learning disabilities, diminished academic performance, behavioral problems and truancy.

What we have found is that children in a caring teaching environment are excited about learning and staying in school. Last year because of JC's compassion, she started an after school tutoring program. When we decided to take on the task, it wasn't about whether we had funds or the time, but what the children needed—extra help in reading and math. The testimonies from the children, "I passed my FCAT", "My teacher presented me with the Gold Star Award" or "I'm going to my next grade" has given us renewed excitement about the program.

Currently, Living Stones' Children of Importance: After School Tutoring and Mentoring Program has 12 kindergarteners to sixth graders. The children decided on this name--because they desire to be important.

Thank God for volunteers such as Pascale Reseau, Mitchell McGee and FSU interns who give their time and talents sowing into young lives. Recently, we were introduced to Bobby Bean, a retiree, who fixes and donates computers. He gave us three computers so some of the children could have one in their homes

60 children can visit and bond with their incarcareted moms and dads. The program's schedule is Liberty CI March 19, 2014; Wakulla CI March 21, 2014; and Gadsden Womens Facility March 24, 2014.

An investment of \$82.50 per child will help children maintain contact with their parents and benefit them emotionally and behaviorally. For less than \$5,000.00, sixty children will have fun reconnecting to their mom or dad, play games/toys, and munch on snacks and lunch. We should invest in our children's futures **now** and prevent the statistic that 70% of inmate's children will be incarcerated during their lifetime.

For instance, the long term cost factor **not investing** in our children will **cost of \$20,000.00 or \$840,000.00** for 42 children. Invest now in these children while their young and the gift you make today will save Y-O-U \$835,000.00 in future dollars. Our children are **priceless** and **worth the investment**.

Living Stones works with 114 children, at three different prisons with future institutions coming on board this year. Thus far, Living Stones has completed ten visits and on average escorts 74 children with 30 caregivers and parents.

Occasionally, we have parents give us anecdotal stories like this one— during a parenting class, a emotional father "shared how he speaks to his son on the phone and last seen him when he was 18 months old. His son, now 10 years old, is asking, "Dad what do you look like. He told him you'll see me on March 19, 2014 God willing."
